



2019 NCRI Excellence Awards Terms and conditions

The National Cancer Research Institute has created four awards to be presented at the 15th NCRI Cancer Conference to mark the anniversary of the event. These awards aim to honour researchers and other individuals who have made a significant contribution to cancer research in the last 5 years.

Definitions

Terms and conditions

The terms and conditions set out in this document.

Recipient

The team or individual recipient of each of the Awards, as selected by the judging panel.

Corresponding Team Member/Primary Nominee

The Corresponding Team Member/Primary Nominee is the person representing the team throughout the award process.

Team

The team supporting the Corresponding Team Member/Primary Nominee in Team applications.

Organisation

The organisation, university or other institution at which the Team or individual is based.

Award

The recognition for which the Team or Primary Nominee are being put forward.

Purpose and eligibility

The purpose of each Award is described under the Award's title. The Recipient must meet all criteria as commended by the judging panel whose decision is final. No more than one Award per category per team will be awarded in any one year.

- Nominations may be made on behalf of individuals/teams who are living at the time of the nomination. An individual can nominate a Team of which s/he is part.
- The Team must be formed of mostly UK-based researchers or contributors to cancer research in the UK.
- Team members may be working within the same Organisation or several organisations, but they must have clearly defined roles within the team.
- Teams comprising academic and industry researchers will be accepted. Including Consumers or patient experts in the team is considered an advantage.
- The Award comprises a commemorative trophy, an invitation to attend the NCRI Cancer Conference and the social event/dinner on the night of the Award ceremony for one member of the Team only. Whilst the conference fees will be waived, travel and accommodation will not be reimbursed unless otherwise agreed.
- The Recipient must be available on Monday 4th November 2019 to take part in the Award Ceremony, collect their trophy and – if relevant – make a short presentation about the Team work.
- Other Team members are encouraged to attend in support of their colleagues.

In all matters relating to the eligibility, nomination and decision-making processes, the most current published guidelines and terms and conditions will take precedence over any information acquired from other sources and the NCRI decision is final. All Recipients must abide by these Terms and Conditions. Recipients will be notified on or before 30 September 2019 and recognised at the NCRI Cancer Conference. The NCRI might decide to arrange a press release or other communications as they see fit. Until any public announcement is made by the NCRI, all information about the Recipients of the Awards and any unsuccessful nominations must be treated as confidential.

NCRI may share such confidential information amongst their stakeholders as relevant and, without further reference to the Recipients or their Organisations, use the information about the Awards and Recipients, including photographs, information provided as part of the nomination and other publishable information held about the Recipients, in their publicity and marketing activities. Recipients should, where possible, support NCRI's endeavour as ambassadors of the work of the NCRI Partnership.

NCRI reserves the right to withdraw the Award if information about the Recipient's professional/ethical malpractice arises or publicity that is likely to have a negative impact on NCRI's reputation emerges.
