When to submit?

Between 16 -23 September 2019

WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR

Taking inspiration from one of the Conference streams, create a video report that will tell a research story to the general public.

Have a look at the Conference website, browse the programme, previous conferences' videos and press releases to get inspired.

You could also consider interviewing a researcher or film your own experiment!

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CONFERENCE STREAMS

Listed below you will find some examples of questions your project might want to focus on.

Cancer discovery

How does a cell become cancerous?

What is cancer immunology?

How does research get translated into the clinic?

What mechanisms exist in the body to protect us from cancer?

Detection, diagnosis and prognosis

How can we use technology to detect cancer earlier?

What's the role of artificial intelligence in early detection of cancer?

Treatment

How do scientists discover and develop new cancer treatments?

How are cancer treatments assessed?

Are there any new treatments on the horizon?

Prevention

How can policy makers influence behaviour to prevent cancer?

Which dietary interventions work to reduce cancer risk?

What do vaccines do?

What is chemoprevention?

Living with and Beyond Cancer

What are the best models of care for people living with and beyond cancer?

What causes fatigue in people living with and beyond cancer and how can it be managed?

What specific lifestyle changes help with recovery from treatment, restore health and improve quality of life?

HOW TO GET INSPIRED

Chose your **TOPIC**

Which one of the themes makes you curious? Pick one that you know about or which inspires you to explore and share with other people!

Find a **FOCUS**

Your report can't cover everything, so decide what you'd like to focus on. Maybe there's a question you'd like to answer?

Carry out **RESEARCH**

What do you need to create your report? Use the internet, books and magazines to gather information. You could even interview an expert on your topic.

Think about **CONTENT**

What key points do you want to cover? What would you like people to learn?

Think about **STRUCTURE**

How will you start your report to get people interested?

Make sure it also has a middle and an ending. Visit the Reach Out Reporter site to see how the right structure helps short films pack a punch – you can even view film transcripts to help you plan your structure.

Make your **FILM!**

You can use a video camera or a device like a phone or an iPad to make your video report. Investigate video editing apps to make the most of your content and structure – as well as giving your report a professional look.

SUBMISSION

Videos should be made by secondary schools students and submitted between 16-23 September 2019.

Video submissions should be no more than 120 seconds in length and should be submitted via Twitter- tagging @NCRI_partners , @Reach_Out_UK, and using the hashtags #NCRI2019_Schools and #ReachOutReporter

Participants must be able to attend the Schools Event at the NCRI Cancer Conference on 5 November 2019, where an overall winner will be announced.
